Ayurveda is an alternative medicine system with historical roots in the Indian subcontinent. The theory and practice of Ayurveda is pseudoscientific. The main classical Ayurveda texts begin with accounts of the transmission of medical knowledge from gods to sages and then human physicians. In Sushruta Samhita, Sushruta wrote that Dhanvantari is Hindu god of Ayurveda.

Ayurveda mainly consists of plant based treatments which derived from roots, leaves, fruits, bark, seeds, such as cardamom and Cinnamon. Consumption of minerals, like sulphur, arsenic, lead, copper sulphate, zinc, gold are also prescribed. The addition of minerals to herbal medicine is called rasa shastra. Some medications used to beat the disease:

1) Tulsi (Ocimum tenuiflorum) : Immunity Booster.

2 Neem (Azardirachta indica) : Blood Purifier, Immunity

Booster etc.

3) Honey : It used to heal wound

ALEXANDER FLEMING DISCOVERY OF PENICILLIN

Penicillin heralded the dawn of the antibiotic age. Before its introduction there was no effective treatment for infection such as Pneumonia, Gonorrhea or Rheumatic fever. Hospitals were full of people with blood poisoning contracted from a cut or a search, and doctors could do little for them but wait and hope.

Antibiotics are compounds produced by Bacteria and Fungi which are capable of killing, or inhibiting, competing microbial species. This phenomenon has long been known; it may explain why the ancient Egyptians had the practice of applying a poultice of moldy bread to infected wounds. But it was not until 1928 that Penicillin, the first true antibiotic, was discovered by Alexander Fleming, Professor of Bacteriology at St. Mary's Hospital in London.

Fleming found that his "mold juice" was capable of killing a wide range of harmful bacteria, such as Streptococcus, Meningococcal and the diphtheria bacillus. He then set his assistants, Stuart Craddock and Frederick Ridley, the difficult task of isolating pure penicillin from the mold juice. It proved to be very unstable, and they were only able to prepare solutions of crude material to work with. Fleming published his findings in the British Journal of Experimental Pathology in June 1929, with only a passing reference to penicillin's potential therapeutic benefits. At this stage it looked as if its main application would be isolating penicillin insensitive bacteria from penicillin-sensitive bacteria in a mixed culture. This at least was of practical benefit to bacteriologist, and kept interest in penicillin going. Others, including Harold Raistrick, Professor of Biochemistry at the London School of Hygiene and Tropical Medicine, tried to purify penicillin but failed.

The term "Penicillin" is often used generally to refer to benzyl penicillin (penicillin G, the original penicillin found in 1928), procaine benzyl penicillin (procaine penicillin), benzathine benzyl penicillin (benzathine penicillin), and phenoxymethylpenicillin (penicillin V). Procaine penicillin and benzathine penicillin have the same antibacterial activity as benzyl penicillin but act for a longer period of time. Phenoxymethylpenicillin is less active against gram-negative bacteria than benzyl penicillin. Benzyl penicillin, procaine penicillin and benzathine penicillin can be given by intravenous or intramuscular injection, but phenoxymethylpenicillin can be given by mouth because of its acidic stability.

OVERVIEW OF AN INDIAN AYURVEDIC HERB: GOKHRU

In Ayurveda two types of Gokhru are used, that is Bada and Chota Gokhru. It consists of dried and fully ripen fruits of Pedalium murex Linn. (Bada gokaru) belonging to family Pedaliaceae and Tribulus terrestris Linn. (chota gokaru) belonging to family Zygophyllaceae.

Synonyms:

Negalu, Neringil, Lahan gokahru, Betha gokharu

Chemical constituents:

Fruit : Alkaloids 3.5%–5%, stable oil, aromatic oil, resins,

glycosides, carbohydrates, saponins and

triterpenoids.

Stem : Saponins, herman, phytosterols, tannins and

carbohydrates.

Root : Reducing sugars, phenolic compounds, saponins,

xanthoproteins, alkaloids, triterpenoids and

flavonoids.

Leaves : Flavonoids, alkaloids, steroids, resins, saponins and

proteins.

Therapeutic Uses:

T. terrestris is very valued for the broad range of properties such as asthma, cough, splenetic diseases, heart disorders, aching of limbs, striating urinary stones, aphrodisiac, anti-inflammatory, anthelmintic, diuretic and used in enemas.

The leaves are used in pharmaceutical industry for preparation of herbal tonic, it plays important role indigestive problems, to increase spermatozoa, to enhance sexual desire and treat urinary tract infection.



OVERVIEW OF AN INDIAN AYURVEDIC HERB: GOKHRU

The fruits are used for coughs, spermatorrhoea, scabies, anemia, ophthalmic and haemostatic. The fruit infusion is exclusively used for kidney disease.

The stem is astringent and is used in gonorrhea. Ash of the whole plant is used for external application in rheumatoid arthritis and roots are reported to be aperients, demulcent and used in the preparation of tonics.

T. terrestris products are easily prepared from roots, shoots, seeds and flowers which are the main source for raising a profitable standard of the pharmaceutical laboratory.

GENETIC TEETH: REGENERATION OF LOST TEETH

A hypothesized fairy tale from Japan says that, tooth fairy is a welcome guest for child who has lost teeth. Not only the fairy leaves a gift under the pillow but the child can be assured of having a new tooth in few months. The same cannot be said to the adult who has lost teeth. In human body genes control everything. Certain segments of DNA are responsible for individual characteristics whereas some control multiple aspects of body. Like nails, horns, teeth are ectodermic in origin. Tooth morphogenesis is regulated by signal transduction network which involve interaction between the epithelial and mesenchymal around bone morphogenetic protein (BMP).

According to the research article published in Journal Science Advances, genes are enough to tell body to grow new teeth. In an individual the number of teeth is strictly controlled whereas in 1% of individuals the increase and decrease of the usual number of teeth is called as tooth agenesis. Genes responsible for tooth agenesis are Msx1, RunX2, ectodysplasin A.

Studies done by Kyoto University and University of Fukui offer some hopes as the teeth reports that an antibody for 1 gene that is Uterine Sensitization associated gene-1 or USAG-1 can stimulate the tooth regrowth in mice with tooth agenesis, a congenital condition. It was found that blocking the USAG-1 gene caused increase in the activity of BMP as it is responsible for adult teeth growth in 1st place. In the study with mice increasing BMP's activity caused them to regrow missing teeth. USAG-1 gene is a bifunctional protein that antagonize BMP and Wnt as these are two signaling molecule essential for tooth regrowth and development.

GENETIC TEETH: REGENERATION OF LOST TEETH

USAG-1 gene interacts with BMP and Wnt which results in several antibodies which show poor survival rate in mice for whole body growth. But one promising antibody disrupted the interaction of USAG-1 and BMP.

Experiments with this antibody revealed that BMP signaling is essential for determining the number of teeth in mice. A single administration of antibody was enough to generate whole teeth and subsequent experiment showed same benefits in ferrets. Ferrets teeth mostly resemble human teeth. Ferrets are diphyodent animals with similar dental pattern to humans. Analysis of mice clarified the genetic factor and molecular and pathological mechanisms for this condition. BMP is also important in supernummery tooth formation which was demonstrated by transplantation of incisors explants supplemented with BMP7 in USAG-1+/- mice induced development of supernummery teeth.

Clinical trials are still going on .The investigation aimed to generate and use monoclonal anti-USAG-antibody rather than genetic inhibition for local arrest and recovery of tooth development. It provides a new therapeutic framework for clinical problems that can currently only be resolved by artificial measures. It was showed that conventional tissue engineering is not suitable for tooth regeneration rather the cell free molecular therapy is effective for wide range of congenital tooth agenesis.

CYTOKINE STORM IN COVID-19

What is a cytokine storm?

A cytokine storm, also called hypercytokinemia, is a physiological reaction in humans and other animals in which the innate immune system causes an uncontrolled and excessive release of pro-inflammatory signaling molecules called cytokines.

Reasons for cytokine storms

- 1. Genetic Syndromes
- 2. Infection
- 3. Autoimmune disease
- 4. COVID-19

Cytokine Storms Syndrome Symptoms

Fevers and chills, Fatigue, Swelling of extremities, Nausea and vomiting, Muscle and joint aches, Headache, Rash, Cough, Shortness of breath, Rapid breathing, Seizures, Tremor, Difficulty coordinating movements, Confusion and hallucinations etc.

COVID-19 and Cytokine Storm

- 1. One of the differences between a mild Covid-19 infection and a fatal affliction could be a chaotic response by the body's own immune system to the virus, known as a cytokine storm.
- 2. Studies have suggested that the condition is because the body doesn't understand how to respond to the relatively new Covid-19 infection and triggers for cytokine production have been seen to be all over the place in patients and immune systems in the most severe cases mount a defense that is more likely to kill pathogens that are not viruses.

- 3. Cytokine storm appears to play a direct role in determining the severity of SARS-CoV-2 . One of the most notable clinical conditions that are associated with cytokine storms includes acute respiratory distress syndrome (ARDS), which has accounted for a significant number of deaths from SARS-CoV-2, in her study.
- 4. Experts believe that if the Covid-19 patient gets severe Cytokine Storm and fails to get treatment in time, it can result in death. The deaths of Covid-19 patients due to multiple organ failure are believed to be caused by Cytokine Storm. Though the Cytokine are part of the Human immune response and help protect the body from various types of infection and diseases, in some Covid-19 patients, they are believed to begin to grow uncontrollably and attack the cells themselves, severely affecting the patient's body. According to the experts, Covid-19 has the potential to make the patient's own immune system his biggest enemy.

Treatments

Timely and effective treatment is essential for CRS, as the symptoms can rapidly worsen and be-come severe.

Doctors will use medication to reduce inflammation safely in people with CRS. Some drugs will target specific cytokines. For example, tocilizumab (Actemra) and siltuximab (Sylvant) reduce the action of the cytokine interleukin-6.

Another option is corticosteroids. These drugs reduce inflammation without targeting a specific cytokine. However, they suppress the immune system and can interfere with cancer treatment.

These treatments may include:

- 1. Intravenous fluids
- 2. Oxygen or ventilator support
- 3. Medicines to support heart function
- 4. Blood product transfusions
- 5. Medicine or dialysis for the kidneys
