

# 'Unknown" Ray

## "Unknown" Ray

## Dr. Rontgen

Wilhelm Rontgen, Professor of Physics in Wurzburg, Bavaria, discovered X-rays in 1895—accidentally—while testing whether cathode rays could pass through glass. His cathode tube was covered in heavy black paper, so he was surprised when a glowing green light nevertheless escaped and projected onto a nearby fluorescent screen.

Rontgen found that the mysterious light would pass through most substances but leave shadows of solid objects. He quickly noticed that rays would pass through human tissue also, rendering the bones and tissue beneath visible. Because he did not know what the rays were, he called them 'X,' meaning 'unknown,' rays.

The image is the first-ever X-ray image of his wife Bertha's hand (wedding ring visible).

News of his discovery spread worldwide, and within a year, doctors in Europe and the United States were using X-rays to locate gunshots, bone fractures, kidney stones, and swallowed objects.

He was honoured for his work with the first Nobel Prize in physics in 1901.

## Ayurvedic Management of Diabetes Mellitus: Type-II

Ancient Indian physicians identified Diabetes mellitus as Madhumeha. Madhumeha is vata kapha pradhan tridoshavyadhi. Diabetes mellitus is a group of metabolic diseases characterized by chronic hyperglycemia resulting from abnormalities in insulin secretion, insulin actionorboth. This hyperglycemia (high blood sugar) produces the symptoms of frequent urination (polyuria), increased thirst (polydipsia), and increasedhunger (polyphagia). If leftuntreated,Diabetes mellitus can lead to many complications likediabetic,ketoacidosis, non-ketotic hyperosmolar coma, heart disease, stroke, kidney failure (nephropathy), foot ulcers, retinopathy, cataracts and glaucoma.

Sahaja (Type-1) and Apathyanimittja (type-2) aretypesof Madhumeha. Othertypes explained in various classicaltexts like Krisha, Dhatukshayajanya and Apatarpanjanyacanbe correlated with Sahaja Madhumeha while Sthula, Avaranjanya and Santarpanjanya canbe correlated with Apathyanimittaja Madhumeha.

Vasant Kusumakar Rasa is potent anti-diabetic drug which possibly acts due to combined effects ofeach of the ingredients of drug. It pacifies tridoshai.e. vata, pitta and Kapha as it contains Praval pishti, Ras sindoor, Mukta Pishti, Abhrak Bhashma, Swarana Bhasma, Rajat Bhasma,Laha Bhasma, Naga Bhasma, Vanga Bhasma, Vasa, Haldi, Ikshu, Kadali, Kamal, Chameli, Shatavari and Chandan. Trivanga bhasma is an Ayurvedic formulation prepared from Lead, Zinc and Tin. It is also a potent antidiabetic as mention in classical texts and proved by various research works. Guduchi again is an anti-diabetic or hypoglycemic drug. Hence, the combination of Vasant kusumakar rasa, Trivanga bhasma and Giloy satva effectively reduced the blood sugar levels. Madhunashani Vati has Guduchi, Jambu, Katuki, Nimba, Kirata Tiktakta, Gudamara, Karavellaka, Kutaja, Go-kshura, Karcura, Haridra, Kala-megha, Babbula, Krishna

## PHARMACIST'S ROLE IN MANAGEMENT OF ANEMIA

Anaemia is a condition in which number of RBC cells are decreased or oxygen carrying capacity of blood is reduced, i.e enough haemoglobin is not available to carry sufficient oxygen from the lungs to supply the needs of the tissues. Iron is an important essential element for almost all living organisms in various metabolic processes, including oxygen transport, synthesis of deoxyribonucleic acid (DNA), electron transport etc. Haematinics are the drugs which are commonly prescribed in the initial treatment of anaemia and also given during pregnancy and lactation phase.

Various types of oral iron preparations(Tablets, syrups, capsules) are available in the market as single or fixed dose combination with other minerals, micronutrients etc. Bioavailability of oral iron preparations depends upon the type of dosage form, its dose, age, sex, food and liquids that are taken along with the iron supplements. Presence of minerals or vitamins in combination also influences the absorption of iron. The main objective of present paper is to elaborate the role of pharmacist in improving bioavailability of haematinics by educating the consumer in selecting right dosage form, right combination and right strength.

The word anemia derived from Greek words 'an' means no and 'anaemia' means blood. Anaemia is defined as a condition where the total number of Red blood cells is decreased and their oxygen carrying capacity is reduced. The normal value of Haemoglobin in men is 13-14 gm/100ml & in women 12 gm/100ml of blood. If men & women having haemoglobin less than the normal values are considered as anaemic.

## Normal daily recommended intake (in mg)

Infant's upto3yrs: 6-10mg. 4-10yrs: 10mg Pregnant women: 30mg. Breast feeding females: 15mg. Anaemia is most common in Females, Children and Elderly.

## Role of pharmacist in the treatment of Anemia

## Right's (Do's)

- Motivate to take immediate release iron supplements. Use combined therapy with ascorbic acid and folic acid.
- Prefer the iron supplements containing divalent salts like ferrous sulphate, ferrous fumerate, ferrous succinate which are cheaper and more bioavailable.
- Take the formulation on empty stomach. If it leads to nausea, gastritis or GI discomfort, then take the product 2 hours after the meals.
- Make sure that the supplement contains not less than33mg of elemental iron.
- Take the dosage form at least for 3 months on daily basis, if too many side effects are faced then take thrice a week for longer time.
- Take the supplements with any juice (orange, lemon, grapes etc) that is rich in ascorbic acid which will help in improving bioavailability of iron.



## Wrong's (Don'ts)

- Don't take supplements containing wrong combinations like the ones with calcium, cobalt, zinc, amino acids and vitamin B complex.
- Do not take eggs, milk products, soya with iron supplements because they decrease or inhibit the iron absorption.
- Don't take calcium supplements with iron preparations. This is most common mistake done by pregnant women who are generally prescribed with these supplements.
- Do not take iron supplements with food substances containing pulses, legumes, cereals which contain high amount of phytates that inhibits absorption of iron strongly.
- Don't take fruits like apple, papaya and vegetables like spinach (rich in polyphenols&phytates) along with iron preparations.
- Don't take iron preparations with coffee, tea or wine (due to presence of polyphenols, phytates) which inhibit iron absorption.

## Conclusion

Anaemia is a disease occurs due to iron deficiency (lack of RBC cells) and effecting millions of people around the world. Iron supplements which are taken orally are cheap, simple to use, safe and effective for treating anaemia. The therapy for anaemia includes right dosage form, right drug, right dose, right time, right combinations if any and most important one is right way and right time of administration to avoid inhibitory food-food & drug–food interactions.

As a community pharmacist, with depth knowledge and experience, he/she should guide the patients in a proper manner and help the Community & Nation to make free anaemic India.

## Lamination of Pharmaceutical Tablets: Classification and Influence of Process Parameters

Lamination is a common industrial problem during the production of pharmaceutical tablets. It corresponds to a failure of the tablet in one or several planes parallel to the surface and passing through the tablet band. But different kinds of lamination exist, and a classification of the different cases is proposed in this work.

Type 1 corresponds to a multiple fracture caused by air entrapment. Type 2 occurs because of the shear stresses developing when the tablet goes out of the die. Type 3, which is limited to convex tablets, is due to a tensile stress developing at the center of the tablet at the end of the unloading that further propagates toward the band. One case of each type was studied experimentally in order to test three solutions classically used at the industrial level: slowing down the press, using a precompression and using a tapered die.

Results shows that, in coherence with the proposed mechanisms, lamination type 1 can be mitigated by slowing down the press or using a precompression. For type 2, only the tapered die solution stopped lamination. None of the solutions completely solved lamination type 3. Nevertheless, the use of a tapered die decreased the severity of the problem avoiding the propagation of the crack until the surface.

Lamination of tablets happens when the product separates into horizontal layers. Lamination is very similar to capping, but occurs in the main body of the tablet, not at the top, and it can occur immediately after compression or during the storage period.
